- FOCUS: Hygiene, self-care, sanitary management.
- TOTAL REACHED: 100 girls living with disabilities



QUARTER 2 IMPACT

1. Menstrual Hygiene Day at Peartree International School:

- Attended by 3 schools in the axis.
- Education on menstrual hygiene + FREE sanitary pads.
- 100 girls reached.

2. Safety for Girl Child (Abigi, Ogun State):

- Students from local and neighboring were empowered with importances of a girl child

3 Medical Outreach (Abigi, Ogun State):

- Elderly individuals from local and neighboring communities came for free health consultations and laboratory tests. Malaria medication was given to those diagnosed with malaria.

- – 60 widows supported.

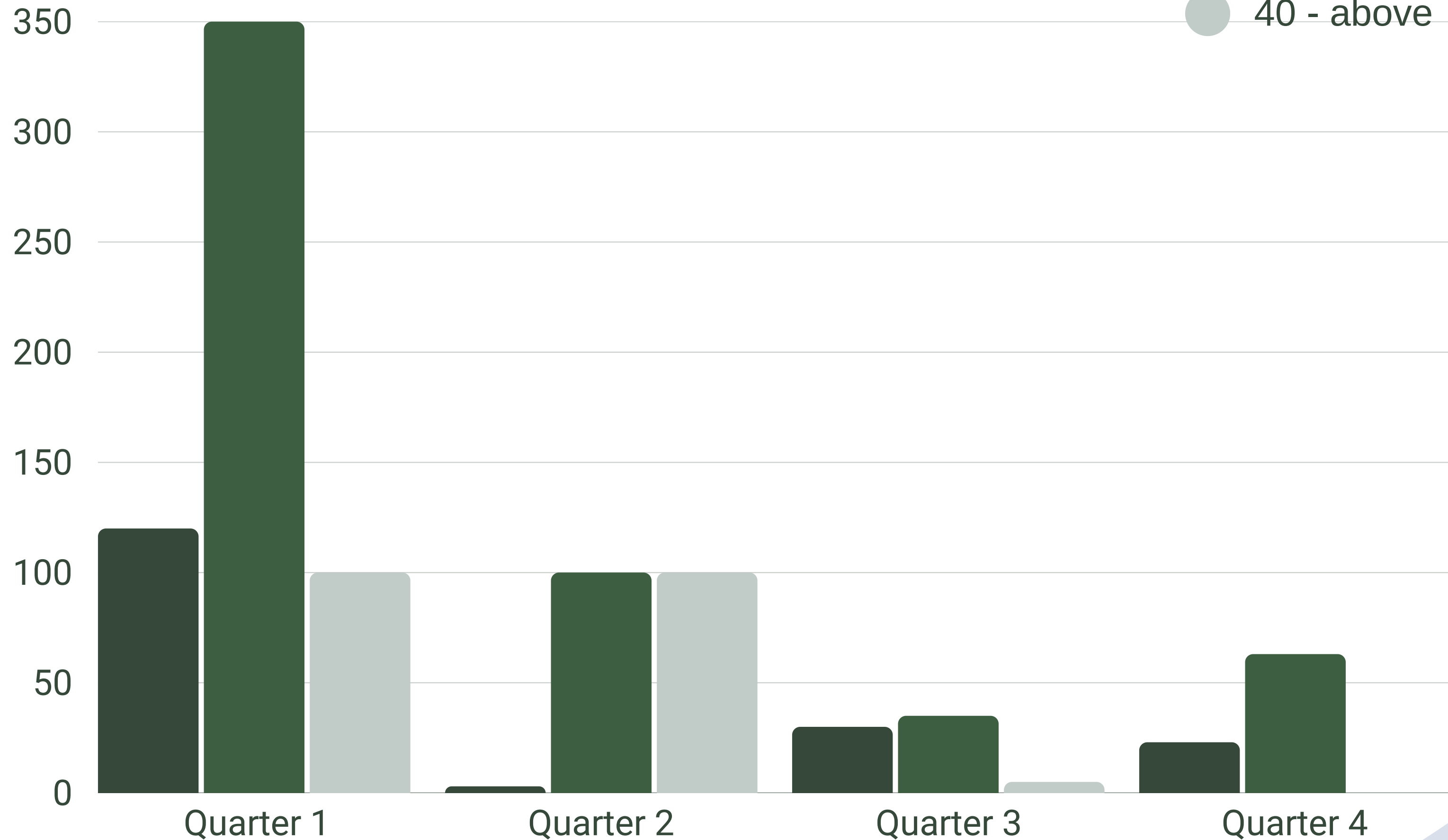
My Body, My Right - Owu Ijebu Day:
